Parsh Meeting

Pastoral Visits to the Hospital

The new government regulations for hospitals no longer collects patient faith information. Without this information concerning the "faith identity" of patients in hospital, we will no longer know your there and so our parishioners in the hospital, or their family will need to tell us and ask clergy to visit them.

Return of Shoeboxes

A reminder to all parishioners who may have shoeboxes not returned yet, they must be returned by Nov. 15th so we can get them to their shipping location on time. Thank You.

Important Meeting for All who Serve

Every 5 years all clergy, staff and volunteers are required to have an educational session on Responsible Ministry in the Church, and some in high-risk positions will also require a police check. This meeting is compulsory to educate parishioners in ministry on what misconduct looks like and their duty to report misconduct of minors, but also vulnerable adults. Individuals who serve in various ministries in the Church always have a duty to report:

The Diocese of Antigonish recognizes that, under the Adult Protection Act, Section 5, all persons have a duty and an obligation to report to the Department of Health, Continuing Care, Adult Protection Services 1-800-225-7225 all information of any real, potential or suspected physical, sexual, financial or emotional abuse and neglect of vulnerable adults sixteen years or older.

"A cleric, religious, paid employee, or volunteer of the Church having any information indicating that a vulnerable adult is being abused or neglected shall give such information immediately to the Department of Health,, Continuing Care, Adult Protection Services 1-800-225-7225 and the local Police Department for investigation. A report shall be complied and a copy shall be submitted to the Bishops' delegate."

Reporting known or suspected cases of abuse is mandatory for all people in Nova Scotia. Therefore, staff and volunteers including members of the clergy are required to report.

"No clergy, diocesan employee or volunteer can absolve themselves from the duty to report by rationalizing they have no "first hand information", that the information is "hearsay" or that someone else will make the report. Failure to report promptly on such complaint risks exposing the vulnerable adult to harm."

We have a duty to report misconduct by a bishop, priest, deacon or lay person. Since clergy and laity work with children, and people of all ages, including vulnerable adults, we need to know the boundaries, expectations and protocols.

The meeting for St Joseph Parish in North Sydney is scheduled for Monday, Nov. 27th at 6:30 pm in the Parish Hall below the Church. Most will only need to attend the educational session and sign to abide by the protocols and some like the priests will also require a police check. Peace, Fr. Doug

Religious Education

What is set forth by the seventh commandment?

The seventh commandment requires respect for the universal destination and distribution of goods and the private ownership of them, as well as respect for persons, their property, and the integrity of creation. The commandment also forbids the unjust keeping or taking of the good of one's neighbor, as well as wronging the neighbor in any way in respect to his/hers good's or property. The Church also finds in this Commandment the basis for her social doctrine which involves the correct way of acting in economic, social and political life, the right and the duty of human labor, justice and solidarity among nations, and love for the poor.
